### CHARITY OF THE MONTH - Camp E-Nini-Hassee

Can you imagine being a teenage girl and living 360+ days a year in the tents shown in this photo? Believe it or not, there are approximately 70 girls currently enrolled in a year-round, outdoor therapeutic camping program right in our own county! The wonderful young ladies at Camp-E-Nini Hassee in Floral City will be next month's "Charity of the Month". Camp E-Nini-Hassee is the only all-girl year-round camp of its kind in the country. The camp is home to girls ages 11 to 19 that come from homes of abuse and neglect. Eckert Youth Camps were founded in 1958, as an alternative for troubled youth. They have been in Citrus County since 1969. In addition to helping troubled teens, they also provide homes for children when they become 18 and have to leave the Foster Care

system. I am in the process of making arrangements for a tour (or 2) to visit the camp next month. In order to make these arrangements, I will need an approximate number of how many women think they will attend, so we can plan accordingly.
